Frequently asked Questions for the LPN program



What will my schedule be like?

Students will have laboratory, classroom, and clinical requirements each semester; 2 full days/week (for nursing courses). Students will be notified at acceptance of the schedule.

Co-required courses (see program map) can be taken prior to admission into the program.

Am I able to work?

Yes; however, it is recommended that you do not work greater than 20 hours per semester.

Frequently asked Questions for the LPN program



Can the co-required courses be transferred from another school?

Typically, yes — Once RVCC receives official transcripts, a transfer evaluation is completed. All co-required courses must be achieved with a grade of "C" or higher. Science courses must be current within the last 10 years.

Can I transfer into the ASN program?

Absolutely! The LPN program is designed to allow for a seamless transition into the ASN program for those who are interested and qualify.

Step 2: Prepare for the TEAS exam

Below are some of the resources available for applicants intending to take the TEAS exam:

- TEAS preparation materials are available for FREE through our library for current students, here.
- Potential students may access print materials for FREE through the library. Potential Students will need to create a community member account at the library before borrowing books for three weeks. - ALL applicants can access the following TEAS prep materials- please note, there is a cost for each: <u>TEAS prep through Ed</u> to Go, <u>ATI TEAS prep materials</u>



Step 3: Register to take the TEAS test

Students must achieve minimum scores in each of the following areas:

Reading-69.0

Math-63.3

Science-43.8

English-56.6

To be eligible, please complete the application by September 30 of the year prior to program entry.

If accepted, students will be notified by October 31 for entry into January program entry year.

**Once accepted, other requirements are due by December 31, of the year prior to program entry.

**This includes a current LNA license. You may qualify for a waiver, if you have previous education in, or are employed in, an Allied Healthcare related field.

Financial Aid (RVCC at LRCC, MCC and WMCC Applicants only)**

- When completing your FAFSA, please select River Valley Community College (River Valley's School code is 007560).
- You will need to complete a Consortium Agreement (<u>found here</u>) for any coursework that you will complete at your host college (LRCC or WMCC).
- RVCC will be your home college for the purposes of this agreement. This is only necessary if you are registering for classes related to the LPN program, or if you are accepted to the LPN program and are studying at a host college.

LPN clinical requirements



Once accepted, other requirements due by December 31 of program entry year, are as follows:

- *Licensure current NH licensure as a Nurse Assistant.
- Basic Life Support Certification
 American
 Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS)
 for Healthcare Providers
- Criminal Background Record A NH and federal criminal background record is required. Any fees are at the expense of the student. A history of a felony or selective misdemeanors may deny entrance into the nursing program.
- Drug Testing Drug testing is required prior to the start of any work-based clinical learning experience. Any fees are at the expense of the student.
- Proof of Medical Insurance Students are required to carry medical insurance to participate in clinical.
- Medical Documentation
 - Physical Exam, and miscellaneous required vaccinations

TEAS = Test of Essential Academic Skill

The TEAS Test



- The TEAS is a nursing school Entrance Exam.
- Objectives assessed on the TEAS exam are those which nurse educators deemed most appropriate and relevant to measure entry level skills and abilities of nursing program applicants.
- It covers broad and varied areas of subject matter.
- Students must score at or above the minimum score
- RVCC can use the best of two consecutive ATI test scores, that were taken within the last two years.

170 multiple-choice questions in 4 areas: English and Reading Math Science Language Usage 209 minutes in length (3 hours, 29 minutes)

How to Register for the TEAS Test

Admission to the LPN program- How does it work?



LPN Admissions Process – How does it work?**

Candidates are ranked numerically by the following scoring criteria at time of application (total of 29 points possible). Candidates are not reviewed for admission until after the September 30 deadline.

- TEAS scores: up to 20 points
 - Reading: 69.0 73.8 (1 point) | 73.8 76.1 (2 points) | 76.2 78.4 (3 points) | 78.5 80.8 (4 points) | 80.9 or greater (5 points).
 - Mathematics: 63.3 70.0 (1 point) | 70.1 73.3 (2 points) | 73.4 76.6 (3 points) | 76.7 80.0 (4 points) | 80.1 or greater (5 points).
 - Science: 43.8 52.1 (1 point) | 52.2 56.3 (2 points) | 56.4 60.5 (3 points) | 60.6 64.6 (4 points) | 64.7 or greater (5 points).
 - English & Language Usage: 56.6 63.3 (1 point) | 63.4 66.6 (2 points) | 66.7 70.0 (3 points) | 70.1 73.3 (4 points) | 73.4 or greater (5 points).
- Completed core requisites for the LPN Program: up to 9 points
- Anatomy & Physiology I, Introduction to Psychology, Human Growth & Development (3 points for each A; 2 points for each B, and 1 point for each C)

^{**}Core-requisites taken outside of CCSNH will need to be reviewed, and may not be approved for transfer.

Your Next Steps



- 1) If interested, please enroll in a prenursing program at your local community college. This will allow you to begin working on your corequisite courses and give you access to an academic advisor and be eligible for financial aid.
- 2) Begin studying and register for the TEAS test
- 3) Obtain New Hampshire Licensed Nursing Assistant licensure (or request waiver)
- 4) Start working on the clinical requirements
