As an assistant to nurses, LNAs will have the skills to:

The Program

The LNA Program is a starting point in the Nursing field. This is a fast-paced 7 week course.

Many LNAs use the knowledge and experience they have gained working in healthcare to gain entrance into competitive LPN and RN degree programs.

The program consists of:

- 40 hours of Classroom Instruction
- 60 hours of Clinicals
- 24 hours of Lab-based Skills

By successfully completing the training program, the student will be prepared to sit for the state certification examination and submit their Board of Nursing LNA license application.
